Regulations of the Ivor Tupper Fund of the Geologists' Association

Conditions of entry:

1. Nominees must be undergraduate students who are in their second, third or fourth (for students in Scotland) year of study at the time of application.
2. The degree subject must be academically relevant to the geological sciences and would typically be a programme in an aspect of Geology or Earth Science.
3. The nomination must be made by the student's Head of Department and only one entrant *per degree programme* can be accepted.
4. The deadline for applications is 15th November and awardees will be notified by March of the following year. Nomination forms should be e-mailed to geol.assoc@btinternet.com by 5pm on the deadline or sent by post to the Geologists' Association, Burlington House, Piccadilly, London, W1J 0DU.

Assessment

1. Each entry will be considered by a panel drawn from the Council of the Geologists' Association and the award will be made to the best student who, in the opinion of the panel, most clearly demonstrates commitment to the subject and academic excellence.
2. It is not possible to appeal against or object to the panel's decision. The panel reserve the right not to make an award in any one year if the quality of the entries is deemed insufficient.

Prize amount:

The successful candidate will receive a cash prize of £2000.

Awards ceremony:

The Ivor Tupper Fund prize will be presented to the recipient at the Association's Annual General Meeting, normally held early in May each year.
